Active in the 1990s, WAC-NS is being re-constituted in response to decisions that are being made at the national, provincial and municipal levels about issues that have a disproportionate impact on women.

On Saturday May 14, 2011 the WACNS will hold their first Annual General Assembly at the McNally Auditorium (McNally Main Building, St. Mary's University).
